

## COVID-19 ADVISORIES

### Antigua & Barbuda

- **Testing:** A negative COVID-19 RT-PCR test result, taken within **7 days** of arrival is required (includes transiting passengers). Effective 23-Jul-21, Children below the age of 5 years are not required to present a negative COVID-19 RT-PCR test to enter the country.
- **Quarantine:** All passengers are subject to quarantine as determined by the Quarantine Authority. Effective 23-Jul-21 All partially vaccinated/unvaccinated returning nationals and residents will be subject to quarantine for fourteen (14) days at a hotel at their own expense or in exceptional cases determined by Port Health Officials, utilize the rooms available at the U.S base at Coolidge. Arriving passengers who are permitted to quarantine at home or instructed to stay at a government quarantine facility will be required to wear a monitoring bracelet according to the quarantine authority regulations.
- **Documentation:** All arriving passengers must complete a health declaration form issued on their flight, to be shared with Port Health Authorities.
- **Vaccination:** Effective 01-JUN-21 Persons providing verifiable proof of full vaccination (at least 2 weeks after the last dose), and a negative COVID-19 PCR test result valid up to 7 days prior to the start of travel, will be allowed to stay at a bio safe/certified accommodation. Effective 23-Jul-21 Returning nationals and residents who present verifiable proof of full vaccination (at least 2 weeks after the last dose), and a negative COVID-19 PCR test result will NOT be required to quarantine.
- **Health Screening:** Completion of a Health Screening Form, temperature check, and additional testing or screening may be required upon arrival or at the hotel or place of lodging as determined by the Health Authorities.
- **Other:** Effective 15-MAY-21 the government has imposed travel restrictions to entry into Antigua and Barbuda on ALL persons who have travelled to the following countries of Brazil and South Africa during the last fourteen (14) days.

### Bahamas

- **Testing:** A negative COVID-19 PCR test result (12 years and older), taken within **5 days** prior to arrival is required. Effective 6-AUG-21 Children between 2 and 11 are required to obtain a Negative Covid-19 test (**Rapid Antigen or PCR**) within 5 days of arrival. Children under 2 years are exempt from testing requirements.
- **Quarantine:** A quarantine period is not required at this time.
- **Documentation:** Customers traveling to the Bahamas (including Bahamian residents) are required to apply for an Electronic Health Visa (<https://travel.gov.bs/>) and provide negative results of a Negative COVID PCR test issued within 5 days prior to arrival. Customers must also complete a daily health questionnaire during their stay.
- **Vaccination:** **As of 06-Aug-2021, customers who are fully vaccinated and two weeks have passed since their last dose, are required to obtain a COVID-19 test (Rapid Antigen or PCR) within 5 days of arrival**

- **Health Screening:** All customers will be subject to health screening. There is no requirement for a COVID test upon arrival unless a person tests positive on a rapid antigen test on day 5.
- **Other:** Customers must enroll in mandatory health insurance coverage when applying for a health visa.
- **Other:** No customer (ALL nationalities) who has been in or transited Haiti on or after 12-FEB-21 will be allowed entry into the Bahamas before 12-Jun-21; whether via direct or indirect flights. *NOTE: Passports should contain NO Entry/Exit stamps for Haiti during the period 12-FEB-21 – 12-June-21*

### Barbados

- **Testing:** All customers entering Barbados are required to present a negative COVID-19 PCR test where samples were obtained within **3 days** prior to arrival and will be subject to a Rapid Antigen test upon arrival. Children under 5 years of age will not be required to have a COVID-19 PCR test unless deemed necessary on arrival.
- **Quarantine:** Customers are required to quarantine for 7-8 days upon arrival at a Government authorized quarantine facility, after such time a 2<sup>nd</sup> test will be administered on day 5, a negative result is required for release from the quarantine facility.
- **Documentation:** An online [Immigration/Customs form](https://travelform.gov.bb/home) (<https://travelform.gov.bb/home>) is required before arrival into Barbados; submit 24 hours prior to travel... To expedite the process, download BIMSafE App (Google or Apple store) to complete the online ED form, upload negative COVID-19 PCR test and complete health questionnaire. The App also provides capabilities for location and monitoring of temperature and symptoms during the first 7 days after arrival. The BIMSafE App will be accompanied by monitoring bracelet which should be worn during the quarantine period.
- **Vaccination:** Effective 08-May-21 Persons providing proof of full vaccination (at least 2 weeks after the last dose), Completed Online Immigration/Customs form and a negative COVID-19 PCR test result taken within 3 days prior to arrival, will be administered with a 2<sup>nd</sup> COVID-19 PCR test at the airport or at an approved accommodation on arrival into Barbados. Persons will be free from quarantine on the same day or 1-2 days, (Dependent on return of a negative test result). The travel history of a fully vaccinated traveller, where they have travelled from or transited through “countries of special consideration” within the 21-day period immediately prior to arrival, will determine which protocols apply. “Countries of special consideration” are those where the prevalence of certain variants of COVID-19 are deemed of particular concern to Barbados Public Health Officials. **Effective 17-Jul-21** Fully vaccinated travellers from the “Travel bubble” (includes Grenada, Antigua & Barbuda, Dominica, Sint Maarten, Turks & Caicos) who present a valid pre-flight negative Covid-19 PCR test will be exempt from further quarantine or testing upon arrival.

- **Health Screening:** Travelers will be subject to health screening on arrival.

- **Other:** Effective 03-May-21, All travellers (vaccinated or un-vaccinated) with a travel history through or from “Countries of Special consideration” within the last 21 days must arrive with a Valid PCR test, have a repeated PCR test at the airport on arrival, quarantine for 7 days (no exceptions) and retest on day 8 to exit. Effective 15-Jul-21 Persons with passports from Brazil, India and South Africa are required to apply for entry visas prior to arrival.

### Cuba

- **Testing:** All customers entering Cuba are required to present a negative COVID-19 PCR test taken within **72 hours** of travel. These **test results must be in printed form**, electronic results will not be accepted. Additionally, all passengers are required to complete a PCR test upon arrival at Havana International Airport and will be subject to a mandatory period of self-isolation until they receive the result of the PCR test.
- **Quarantine:** After testing, Customers will then be required to self-quarantine 6 days/5nights in a government-approved facility/hotel until a health official provides a negative test result for a test conducted on the fifth day. If the test results are negative, no further quarantine is required. If PCR test results are positive, Customers will be required to quarantine in a government facility as mandated by the Health Department. The cost of the government-approved facility is assumed by the Cuban Government only for Cuban residents residing in Cuba. For Cuban residents not residing in Cuba and foreigners, the cost of the hotel will be assumed by the traveler. The government-approved facility options are available at [www.havanatursa.com](http://www.havanatursa.com)
- **Documentation:** Proof of negative test results must be in printed form. Electronic results will not be accepted.
- **Health Screening:** Health screening may be required upon arrival in Cuba.

### Dominica

- **Testing:** Effective 23-Jul-21 All customers (2 years and above) entering Dominica are required to present a negative COVID-19 PCR test where samples were obtained within **24-72 hours** prior to arrival. All travellers aged (1 year and above) will be administered with an Antigen and/or PCR swab upon arrival.
- **Quarantine: Unvaccinated travellers** and Persons coming from a **high-risk** country must quarantine at a government operated quarantine facility or Managed Experience at a safe in Nature certified property for a minimum of 5 days. A PCR test will be administered on day 5 and await a negative result for up to 48 hours; traveller will be deemed medically cleared at the discretion of medical officials. Persons coming from **Low and Medium risk** countries will be administered with a Rapid Antigen test on arrival, if test result is negative, traveller will be deemed medically cleared at the discretion of medical officials

- **Documentation:** All customers (1 year and above) traveling to Dominica are required to apply for Notification of Health Clearance (<https://domcovid19.dominica.gov.dm/>) at least 24 hours prior to arrival. Notification of Clearance and Negative PCR test results must be presented to airline prior to boarding.
- **Vaccination:** Effective 07-Jul-21 Persons providing proof of full vaccination (at least 2 weeks after the last dose), Notification of health clearance and a negative COVID-19 PCR test result valid up to **24-72** hours prior to arrival, will be administered with a rapid antigen test upon arrival. There shall be no mandatory quarantine, upon receipt of a negative Antigen test result for travellers who have been medically cleared on arrival.
- **Health Screening:** All customers will be subject to health screening and a PCR and/or Rapid antigen testing on arrival.

### Dominican Republic

- **Testing:** COVID testing is no longer required prior to departure. However, random testing may happen upon arrival. Between 3 and 15% of passengers and those presenting symptoms will be subjected to an aleatory breath test, passengers under the age of 5 are exempted from this procedure.
- **Quarantine:** A positive test result or passengers who present with symptoms will be isolated and attended to at authorized locations.
- **Documentation:** All arriving and departing travellers are required to complete an online digital form (Electronic Ticket) which replaces all paper-based forms <https://eticket.migracion.gob.do/>. It is recommended filling out the form 72 hours before departure, printing or making a screenshot of the QR code and keeping it on hand until arrival where it will be scanned by authorities at Customs.
- **Health Screening:** All customers traveling to the Dominican Republic will be subject to health screening, including temperature checks and may include COVID PCR test, upon arrival.
- **Other:** Effective 28-Jun-21 Passengers from the United Kingdom (England, North Ireland, Scotland, and Wales), Australia, Brazil, Democratic Republic of Congo, India, Indonesia, Iraq, Iran, Ireland, Kuwait, Monaco, **Saint Vincent and the Grenadines**, Senegal, South Africa, Sweden, Syria, Thailand, Tunisia, and (**Spain** – as of 14JUL21), including those who have travelled via a third country and those who have been in those countries in the last (14) fourteen days or less, **must present a negative COVID-19 PCR test taken no more than 72 hours before arrival or a vaccination card with no more than 3 weeks after the last dose was given... For passengers arriving from Spain, a negative Antigen test or a negative PCR test are both acceptable.**

### Grenada

- **Vaccination:** Effective 31-Jul-21 All persons (exceptions are citizens, Residents, Persons under 13, Diplomats) entering Grenada must be fully vaccinated (at least 2 weeks after the last dose). All customers entering Grenada are required to present a negative COVID-19 PCR test taken within **72 hours** of travel. Children under 13 years will spend 48 hours in quarantine once they are accompanied by a fully vaccinated individual.
- **Quarantine:** Travellers must have a minimum 2-day reservation at one of the [Pure Safe Travel Accomodations](https://www.puregrenada.com/travel-advisory/) (<https://www.puregrenada.com/travel-advisory/>) or apply for home quarantine at least 7 days prior to arrival. All travellers (over 5 years) will undergo a Covid-19 PCR test on arrival and receive results in 48 hours; if negative the traveller will be released once medically cleared.
- **Documentation:** Customers traveling to Grenada must complete the online pre-travel information (including acceptance of the Waiver of Liability Agreement), upload relevant documents, and have a printed copy to present upon arrival. All travel documentation can be found at: <https://covid19.gov.gd/>.
- **Health Screening:** All travellers will undergo health screening on arrival (symptoms review, temperature checks, and testing if deemed necessary)
- **Other:** Effective 04-May-21 Grenada (GND) has implemented a travel ban on all persons with a 14-day travel history from India and Brazil.

### Haiti

- **Testing:** Customers 5 years and older, must provide a negative COVID-19 PCR or antigen test result taken within **72 hours** prior to departure. If the customer has had a positive test result in the past, they must also have a doctor's note indicating they have recovered and are cleared to travel.
- **Quarantine:** Customers may be required to quarantine at home.
- **Documentation:** Customers must complete a Health Declaration Form.
- **Health Screening:** Customers may be required to do a health screening upon arrival.
- **Other:** Additionally, customers must:
  - Provide truthful information.
  - Undertake to respect the instructions of the MSPP during the trip and for the entire duration of the stay on Haitian soil.
  - Be accessible and agree to provide information on their state of health during the 14 days of home quarantine.

### Jamaica

- **Testing:** All travelers (12 years of age and over) regardless of nationality (including Jamaicans) are required to show proof of a negative COVID-19 PCR or Antigen test performed by an accredited lab for which the sample was collected within **3 days** of the travel date, along with an approved Travel Authorization form prior to boarding. *NOTE: Between March 1,2021 and April 13,2021, a person who is not a citizen of Jamaica, and*

*has been in the United Kingdom within 14 days of their intended date of entry, will not be approved for travel.*

- **Quarantine:** All customers must stay at their hotel, resort, or residence until they receive their COVID test results. Tourists must remain in an approved “Stay in Resilient corridor” during their stay. Travelers are also required to sign a Quarantine Order (usually 14 days). For more information, visit the [Jamaica Ministry of Health and Wellness \(https://www.moh.gov.jm/\)](https://www.moh.gov.jm/)
- **Documentation:** Customers traveling to Jamaica are required to complete and submit a travel Authorization form within seven(7) days of the intended travel date; non-residents(<https://jamcovid19.moh.gov.jm/>) and residents (<https://www.visitjamaica.com/>). Travelers may be required to download the JAMCOVID19 App for monitoring by the health department. Travelers would need to check in daily on the app.
- **Health Screening:** Travelers will be subject to health screening and risk assessment upon arrival.
- **Other:** For more information on travel to Jamaica, please visit <https://www.visitjamaica.com/travelauthorization/>
- **Other:** Effective 05-May-21 Jamaica has implemented a travel ban on all non-citizens of Jamaica who’ve been in Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Paraguay, Peru, Trinidad and Tobago and India during the period 05-MAY-21 to 02-JUN-21. Nationals of Jamaica seeking entry must quarantine at a government designated facility for no less than 48 hours and retested for COVID-19 pending a negative test result upon entry. *NOTE: NO person travelling directly from any of the specified countries above and who is not a citizen of Jamaica shall be permitted to enter Jamaica.*

### Puerto Rico

- **Testing:** Beginning 28-APR-21, every traveler is required to present proof of a negative PCR molecular or Antigen COVID-19 test taken no more than **72 hours** prior to arrival. If the traveler arrives without a test, they will be required to upload test taken on the island, within 48 hours of arrival, or receive a \$300 fine.
- **Quarantine:** If the uploaded result is negative, no quarantine required. If the result is positive, the person must isolate and follow local isolation protocols at his/her own expense.
- **Documentation:** All arriving passengers must complete the Puerto Rico Department of Health travel declaration form and upload the negative COVID-19 test result <http://www.travelsafe.pr.gov/> or [www.viajaseguro.pr.gov](http://www.viajaseguro.pr.gov/). This will generate a QR Code that must be presented at the airport.
- **Vaccination:** The Department of Health and the government of Puerto Rico will continue to require a negative PCR molecular or Antigen COVID test taken within 72 hours to enter the island for international travelers regardless of the passenger’s vaccination status. *Effective 25-May-21 a negative COVID-PCR test will not be required for fully vaccinated travellers on domestic flights. Travellers are required to upload official Vaccination Card, as proof of vaccination through the Travel Declaration Form portal. Note: Uploaded must be of official vaccination card, A copy will not be accepted*
- **Health Screening:** Thermal cameras will be used to check body temperatures.

### St. Lucia

- **Testing:** All arrivals (5 years and older) to St. Lucia must have a negative COVID-19 PCR test result, taken no more than **5 days** before arrival.
- **Quarantine:** Travelers must quarantine at a Covid-19 approved hotel/property site or at a government institutional quarantine facility during the first 14 days of their stay. Tourism is restricted to COVID-certified hotels and resorts with a confirmed reservation. If the customer tests positive for COVID-19, the customer will be transferred to the Respiratory Hospital for treatment and care at their cost.
- **Documentation:** Travelers must complete a [Travel Registration Form](https://www.stlucia.org/en/covid-19/travel-registration-form/) (<https://www.stlucia.org/en/covid-19/travel-registration-form/>) prior to departure and may be asked to upload COVID PCR negative test results in the form. Travelers should also be prepared to show test results upon arrival.
- **Vaccination:** Effective 01-Jul-21 Persons providing documented proof of full vaccination (at least 2 weeks after the last dose), pre-arrival registration form and a negative COVID-19 PCR test result taken within 5 days/120 hours prior to arrival, will not be required to quarantine on entry into St. Lucia; subject to the discretion of the Chief Medical Officer *NOTE: All travelers – including those who have been vaccinated – must follow all protocols.*
- **Health Screening:** Travelers will be subject to health screening upon arrival.

### St. Maarten

- **Testing:** A COVID rt-PCR test from a naso-pharyngeal swab performed within **72 hours** prior to departure to Sint Maarten (last leg in case of connecting flights) is required for all travelers originating from a country that is categorized as **high-risk** (includes the BVI). Children age 10 & under and Travelers residing in and/or traveling from a **low-risk** country (who have not visited a high-risk country in the **14 days prior**) are **exempted** from the mandatory rt-PCR or antigen test. Customers are required to upload their negative COVID-19 PCR result on [www.stmaartenentry.com](http://www.stmaartenentry.com). ...Note: As of 01-Jul-21 the RT-PCT test must be performed on a naso-pharygeal swab within 72 hours or 48hrs for an antigen test, before departure by travelers originating from the USA and Canada
- **Quarantine:** For travelers originating from a high-risk country, 5 consecutive days of self-monitoring of body temperature and possible flu like symptoms is mandatory.
- **Documentation:** All passengers must complete a health declaration form at least 12 hours before departure obtained at <https://stmaartenehas.com/application-form/> and

must also present a pre-approved e-mail authorization at check-in and upon arrival. All travelers (except residents, transit passengers, French national...) are required to apply for mandatory COVID-19 insurance [www.sxmprotectionplan.com](http://www.sxmprotectionplan.com).

- **Vaccination:** Effective 15-JUN-21 all Fully Vaccinated Residents from St. Maarten, St. Martin and the BES Islands can enter St. Maarten without testing when originating from a High-Risk country, however, when originating from a banned country a RT-PCR test within 72 hours before departure must be performed in addition to being fully vaccinated for 2 weeks or more.
- **Health Screening:** All incoming passengers are subjected to temperature checks and other screening protocols and may be subjected to mandatory testing at their own expense.
- **Other:** Travel ban effective 27-JAN-21 for travellers departing from and who've been in a "banned country" for 14 days before departing to Sint Maarten. (Includes- Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Ecuador, French Guyana, Guyana, India, Nepal, Pakistan, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, South Africa, Surinam, Trinidad & Tobago, Uruguay, Venezuela). **Sint Maarten/Sint Martin/Saba/St. Eustatius residents are exempted from the travel ban and should get a rt-PCR test before departure.**

### St. Vincent & the Grenadines

- **Testing:** All travelers must arrive with a negative COVID-19 RT-PCR test result, taken no more than **72 hours or 3 days** before arrival. Travellers from Very-High, High, and Medium-risk countries may be retested on arrival.
- **Quarantine:** Travellers from **Very-High Risk** countries must mandatory **14-21 days** quarantine and retested on day 7 and 14 of quarantine/Travellers from **High-risk** countries must mandatory **14 days** quarantine and retested between day 4 and 7 of quarantine/ Travellers from **Medium-risk** countries must mandatory quarantine for **7 days** and retested on day 4 of quarantine; in a Tourism authority/MOHWE approved Transition/Quarantine hotel at their own cost. **Must arrive with proof of fully paid reservation**... Quarantine is not required for Travellers from **Low-Risk** Countries if no evidence of onboard vessel exposure and not in a high-risk occupation. *Note: The country of residence will be the last country that the traveller was present in for at last 21 days*
- **Documentation:** All customers traveling to St. Vincent & the Grenadines are required to complete a Pre-Arrival Form [www.health.gov.vc](http://www.health.gov.vc)
- **Vaccination:** Travellers must present a vaccine certificate in English as evidence of being fully vaccinated (at least 2 weeks after the last dose) by a competent authority and arrive with a Negative RT-PCR test taken no more than 72 hours before arrival. Travellers from **Very-High Risk** countries must mandatory **7 days** quarantine and retested on day 6 of quarantine. Travellers from **High-risk** and **Medium-risk** countries may be retested on arrival and must quarantine for **48 hours** at an approved facility at their own cost. **Low-risk** countries requires no quarantine if no evidence of onboard

vessel exposure and not in a high-risk occupation. *Note: The country of residence will be the last country that the traveller was present in for at last 21 days*

- **Health Screening:** All customers will be subject to health screening.
- **Other:** For more information on travel to St. Vincent & the Grenadines, please visit [www.health.gov.vc](http://www.health.gov.vc)

### Turks and Caicos

- **Testing:** Effective 28-JUL-21 A negative COVID-19 RT-PCR, NAA, RNA or Antigen test result, taken no more than **3 days** prior to arrival is required. Children under the age of 10 are exempt from the test requirement. *Note: Only results from oropharyngeal and nasopharyngeal samples will be accepted for PCR tests. Only results from nasopharyngeal samples will be accepted for Antigen tests. Antibody tests will NOT be accepted. Results from home-based test kits will NOT be accepted.*
- **Quarantine:** No quarantine requirements are in place at this time.
- **Documentation:** Customers must complete the online health screening questionnaire and obtain a pre-approved [TCI Assured Travel Authorization \(https://travelauthorisation.turksandcaicostourism.com/public/\)](https://travelauthorisation.turksandcaicostourism.com/public/) before travel. The PCR test results should be uploaded to the TCI Assured portal no less than 24 hours before arrival. Customers are required to show their approved TCI Assured (hard copy or electronic copy) before boarding.
- **Vaccination:** Effective 01-May-21 **Returning Residents** who are fully vaccinated (at least 2 weeks after the last dose), will not be required to upload a COVID-19 PCR negative test to the TCI Assured Portal. *All persons entering TCI MUST apply for and present a TCI Assured Certificate prior to entry.* To benefit from the waiver returning residents must be fully vaccinated in the TCI and their name on the TCI register of persons who were vaccinated in the TCI. **NOTE: Residents who were vaccinated outside of the TCI do not qualify under this waiver.**
- **Health Screening:** Customers must complete the online health screening questionnaire.
- **Other:** Customers must have medical/travel insurance that covers medevac, any costs related to quarantine, ambulance care or care at the local hospital.

### VIRGIN ISLANDS (BRITISH)

- **Testing:** A negative COVID-19 RT-PCR test result, taken within **5 days** is required for all travelers prior to arrival. Children below 5 years DO NOT require PCR test.
- **Quarantine:** Travellers must quarantine for 7 days at an Approved Travel Accommodation and are subject to RT-PCR testing upon arrival. Persons applying for home quarantine must begin application process 7 days prior to arrival.

- **Documentation:** All customers (including children) traveling to the British Virgin Islands (BVI) are required to register on the BVI Gateway Travel website <http://bvigateway.bviaa.com/>, application must be completed 48 hours prior to travel, a Travel Authorization Certificate will be received within 24 hours upon successful review.
- **Health Screening:** All customers will be subject to health screening.
- **Vaccination:** Effective 07-JUL-21, Persons providing proof of full vaccination (at least 2 weeks after the last dose), Travel Authorization Certificate and a negative COVID-19 RT-PCR test or an approved Antigen test taken within 5 days of travel, will be subjected to a rapid test upon arrival (day 0). The traveler will NOT be required to quarantine or to wear a geofencing device once their arrival test is negative.
- **Other:** Travellers originating or transiting through Brazil and India who are granted permission to enter the BVI are required to provide a 5-day RT-PCR negative test prior to entry and must undergo mandatory 14-day quarantine.
